Message for the week of May 26: A Minute with Jesus: The Eucharist and the Most Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit Jesus gave His life for us so that our sins could be forgiven and we could be united in a relationship of love with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We refer to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as the most Holy Trinity—three persons in one God. When we receive the Eucharist, we are not only receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus but all three persons of the Blessed Trinity. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you" (Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 13:14).

It is an occasion to profess our faith in the sacrament of the Eucharist, to thank Jesus for the gift of His cross and presence in this sacrament—and to walk with Him toward the promised land of heaven. 

### From the Pastor's Pen

### SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them.

This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons. God has revealed to us three separate functions that are carried out by the Three Persons. It is proper to attribute to God the Father the work of creation, to God the Son the work of Redemption and to God the Holy Spirit the work of Sanctification. Our knowledge of God as Trinity is made possible by God, who has chosen to be revealed as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As Father, God has brought forth the created universe, including our own being. As Son, Jesus has made known a God who hears our cries, who cares, who counts the hairs on our head and who loves us so passionately that He became one of us in order to suffer for our sins, and even to die for us. As Spirit, God remains with us and within us.

The foundation of our faith in God and our profession of God as a Trinity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit reaches its highpoint in the event of Jesus Christ, whose life, words, and actions reveal the relationship of three persons in one God. Through Jesus Christ, you and I are brought into that same loving and life-giving relationship with our God. Today, in praise and adoration of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we pray that He who unites us to himself will continue to protect and guide us and bring us all more deeply into His divine life. May the God of perfect relationship strengthen our relationship with Him and with one another and strengthen our witness to His presence and saving power in our world.

- Establishing, accompanying and reinforcing local Church communities; -Reconciliation, healing and rehabilitation programs for the victims of ethnic wars; -Providing houses for the indigent, building and maintaining Chapels and Schools in remote villages; -Shelters for the abandoned and street children; livelihood and food program production programs. In particular, the beneficiaries are people of God in: South America (Bolivia, Mexico, Argentina, Paraguay, Perú); Asia and Oceania (Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia); Africa (Guinea Bissau, Libya, Mozambique, South Sudan, Tanzania).
