Message for the week of June 2: A Minute with Jesus:

The Holy Eucharist is Jesus Christ, really and truly present. The Feast of Corpus Christi celebrates the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At the consecration of every Mass, the priest prays the words that Jesus Himself pronounced over bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is My Blood." The bread is no longer bread, and the wine is no longer wine. We receive Jesus Himself as nourishment for our souls. This week, read these words of Jesus every day: "Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day". (John 6: 54).

The Body and Blood of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into Heaven.

Jesus comes to us in every Mass.

The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.

How do I receive Communion well?

- 1. Be ready! Think about what is going to happen. Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul. If you do, then go to confession first.
- 2. Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion. This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.
- 3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: Corpus Christi

This Sunday we celebrate Corpus Christi – the Body of Christ! Although we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Church wants to emphasize its importance by a special feast, formerly called "Corpus Christi." It was Pope Urban IV who first extended the feast to the universal Church. We believe that the presence of Christ in the Eucharist is real, true, and substantial. Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). By his Real Presence in the Eucharist Christ fulfils his promise to be with us "always, until the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). In the Eucharist the Church receives the gift of Jesus Christ himself.

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This coming Friday, June 7th, is the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The history of this special feast goes back to the appearance of Jesus to a religious sister named St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the promises He gives to those who practice this devotion.

On the same day June 7, 2024, Bishop Robert Barron, the National Eucharistic Pilgrims and the pilgrims from the Diocese of Winona-Rochester will meet Bishop Gerard Battersby and our diocese on the Cameron Street Bridge in La Crosse, Wisconsin, to transfer the Blessed Sacrament to the Diocese of La Crosse. The procession will then walk to the La Crosse Center for "the ANSWER". I encourage all those who can participate please do so.

Next weekend we will have a missionary priest. I like to welcome Father Percival Tayem, OFM (Franciscan Missionary). Please be generous with your support. Supporting the global mission of the church.

- -Reconciliation, healing and rehabilitation programs for the victims of ethnic wars;
- -Providing houses for the indigent, building and maintaining Chapels and Schools in remote villages;
- -Shelters for the abandoned and street children; livelihood and food program production programs.
