Today's Gospel reading tells us that Jesus' relatives were trying to get close to Him when there was a huge crowd. But Jesus didn't get up to see them or make the other people go away. 



Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time continues our journey through the Gospel of Mark, and it brings us to a very fascinating passage from that Gospel that gives us an account of the conflict that took place in Jesus' hometown over his exorcisms that he was performing. The second part of the gospel deals with the concerns of His family and how Jesus defines his family.

In Mark chapter 3, Jesus' family is either frustrated with him, or worried about him. They hear that Jesus is drawing crowds again, some people think he's possessed. And his family is either embarrassed, or worried of what might become of him. They know that Jesus' life has undergone significant changes. Imagine what Mary and Jesus' family have observed of him: For 30 years he lived a quiet family life, then suddenly he's baptized and goes on a 40 day fast in the desert. When he returned, he's now a public preacher. He's saying the kingdom is at hand and telling people to repent. Unlikely fishermen are following him, driving out spirits & healing. He's spending time with unsavory characters like tax collectors, prostitutes, beggars. Crowds follow him; he's not eating or sleeping. If you were his relative, wouldn't you worry and wonder?

The family of Jesus didn't fully understand that Jesus has a mission, and that his message had an urgency about the reign of God and discipleship that transcended natural family bonds. So, when Jesus says: "whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." He opens up the tent and allows everyone who wants to enter the chance to enter. Be partners of his mission. The door to the family homestead is wide-open. Join the family. He needs us.

This weekend we will have a missionary priest. I like to welcome Father Fr. Percival Tayem, OFM (Franciscan Missionary). Please be generous with supporting the global mission of the church. Have a great week.

<u>Parish Mission</u>: This weekend we have a mission priest here, Fr. Percival Tayem, OFM from the Franciscan Missions. There will be a 2nd collection taken up for his mission. The following is their message: Peace and blessings! Franciscan Missions (GSFM) under the direction of the Minister General of the Order of Friars Minor (OFM) in Rome, Italy, coordinates the Mission Appeals of our Friars collaborating with us in the Mission Cooperative Plan of the Archdiocese and Diocese in the United States. The generous donations received are used to prepare missionaries and support in solidarity with those in needs. While responding to the spiritual hunger of the people, corporal necessities are also met thru human development projects directed most specifically to the poor and marginalized as our Holy Father St. Francis of Assisi identified himself with them. Some of the efforts are:

- Establishing, accompanying and reinforcing local Church communities;
- -Reconciliation, healing and rehabilitation programs for the victims of ethnic wars;
- -Providing houses for the indigent, building and maintaining Chapels and Schools in remote villages;
- -Shelters for the abandoned and street children; livelihood and food program production programs.

<u>Focusing on Fathers</u>: For several years we have been asked when we will do something special to honor the dads on Father's Day. Strong dads are the key to building a pro-life society. Show your "Pop" some love with a "corny" gift. We will be selling personal sized popcorn bags after mass on Father's day weekend (June 15th & 16th). The suggested donation is \$3 per bag or 2 for \$5. The money collected will fund Pro-Life Wisconsin's efforts to cultivate a culture of life.
