Message for the week of August 11: A Minute with Jesus: The Eucharist is called Holy Mass The word "Mass" comes from the Latin word "Missa." Missa is related to the word "mission," the root of the English word "mission." At Mass, we come to receive the Eucharist—the Real Presence of Jesus. He gives Himself to us out of love, to strengthen us in living out the Christian life. At the end of Mass, we are dismissed with the words, "The Mass is ended, let us go in peace to love and serve the Lord." Each of us is sent on mission, to show our love for God by loving and serving others and passing on the Catholic Faith to them. We want to help others to know the Truth – Jesus Christ – so that they also can find peace, which only He can give. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, please give me the courage to speak about my friendship with You in simple ways to others, when the opportunity arises. And let my actions speak louder than any words I say. This week, read how we are to serve others in Hebrews 6:10. "Through love serve one another."







From the Pastor's Pen

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel (Jn 6:41-51) describes Jesus' discourse in the synagogue at Capernaum after his miraculous feeding of the five thousand. During the discourse, Jesus reveals himself as the true "Bread of Life that came down from Heaven," to give life to the world. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world". Thus humankind, which remained subjected to death, gain entry to immortality once more through Christ. By eating the flesh of Christ, the Savior of us all and drinking His blood, we have life in ourselves, we become one with Him, we remain in Him and He in us. Therefore, eucharist has become a life-giving blessing. How many of us do believe?

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Thursday, August 15th, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the oldest feast day of Our Lady. In 1950 Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of the Church. It is a holyday of obligation this year. We will have an anticipation mass on August 14th at 8:00 pm at St Peters and mass on August 15th at 5:30 pm at St Joseph. On this feast day of Our Lady, we celebrate God's crowning of His work in the Blessed Mother as she ends her earthly life and enters eternity. The Assumption completes God's work in Mary since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God himself should ever undergo corruption. This feast turns our eyes to heaven where we hope to follow when our earthly life is over. The Assumption looks to eternity and gives us hope that we, too, will follow Our Lady when our life is ended. As we celebrate this great feast, lets offer ourselves to our blessed mother. Happy feast of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary!
