Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

This weekend we find Jesus in the district of Decapolis which was largely a gentile territory. Jesus' ministry was open to all, not just to the Jesus. We read about a deaf man brought to Jesus for healing. Jesus took him aside, away from the crowd, touched him and healed him, using the words "*Ephphatha!*".

Hearing is an important activity in life. It links us with the outside world just as sight. Hearing loss is frustrating for those who have it and for their loved ones. It contributes to social isolation. One can also become Spiritually hard of hearing. That is when one become deaf to voices that cries out to us. The voice of God, conscience and other. Sometimes we conveniently stop listening. There is a danger in it. The ability to hear God speaking to you is essential to Christian life. We all have times when the Lord should come to us and say "*ephphatha*" – be opened. We need the Lord to whisper *ephphatha* into our souls. The need for healing, for *ephphatha* never really stops. Jesus came to "open" to liberate, to enable us to fully live our relationship with God and with others. This word, "Ephphatha – Be opened," sums up Christ's entire mission. May our ears and heart be opened that we may discern his voice.
