Message for the week of October 13:

A Minute with Jesus: Recognize God's love in that He sent His Son to give us the Eucharist. It's so important to remember that God is not just loving but He is LOVE itself. Our Heavenly Father reveals – shows us – that He is love and that He desires to share His love by creating us. He created each one of us out of love. Our Heavenly Father only wants to love us. We are able to recognize His love in that Our Father sent His only Son in order to give Himself to us in the Eucharist and to give His life for us on the Cross. Let's pray this now and every day this week: Heavenly Father, thank you for Your love for me. Read how St. John explains how we know that God is love: "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us" (1 John 4: 7-12).







From the Pastor's Pen

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The rich young man in today's Gospel, responding to the invitation of Jesus, seeks to go beyond the basics of his faith that he practiced from his youth to follow Jesus, but the price is too high for him. He is not yet ready to give up his wealth and prestige. It is so easy to get caught in the same trap as the rich young man. After all, what he had wealth, possessions, power and prestige are held up and respected in many cultures of our world. Many would label the rich young man as foolish to give up all the advantages he had always enjoyed to follow a preacher.

In contrast, the Apostles, who admittedly had less to give up than the rich young man, were more easily willing to give up all they had to follow Jesus. Yet, they also took a risk giving up their trades and a way of life that they knew and that had become comfortable for them in order to follow Jesus. Like the rich young man, they were drawn to Jesus, but unlike him, they were able to give up their families to follow Jesus.

Jesus continues to call us and the people of our world to follow Him, to take on His values and those of the Gospel, to prefer God to riches and pleasures. Manage possessions wisely, so that they do not gain control over our hearts.

World Mission Sunday is Oct. 19-20, 2024. "Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet", always celebrated on the second to last Sunday of October is World Mission Sunday. It is a special day that unites Catholics worldwide in prayer, solidarity, and support for the Church's mission efforts. This year's theme, chosen by Pope Francis, is rooted in the Gospel of Matthew: "Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet," reflecting the inclusive and urgent call to bring God's love to everyone. We will have a second collection for it on October 20th.

2024-2025 Diocesan Annual Appeal begins on this weekend. This year's theme is rooted in 1 Corinthians 3:9: "For We are God's Co-Workers." The theme highlights the collaborative relationship between God and us, the faithful, in building His kingdom.
