Every year on the last Sunday before Advent, we celebrate the feast day of Christ the King.


Jesus is a good king who loves His people so much that He died so we could go to Heaven.



#### From the Pastor's Pen

## The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The liturgical year of the Church concludes with this Feast of Christ the King, instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to celebrate the Jubilee Year and the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea. The Council of Nicaea was convened on July 4th 325. It was the first council in the history of the Christian church that was intended to address the entire body of believers. It was convened by the emperor Constantine to resolve the controversy of Arianism.

Solemnity of Christ the King reminds us that our earthly cities, governments, and rulers will pass away, and that our lasting city will be in heaven, with Jesus Christ as our only King and Ruler. "When He comes again in glory" (Mt. 25:31) "the Lord will reign as king forever" (Psalm 29:10) and "all things will be subjected to His rule." (1 Corinthians 15:28). In the preface of today's Mass it is mentioned that his kingdom will be "an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace". How blessed we are to know that we are his subjects and He is our King.

As the month of November draws to a close, we continue to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Book of Remembrance will remain open during this whole month. Next Sunday, December 1, we begin a new Liturgical Year with the Season of Advent. At the entrance of the church there will be several copies of Advent and Christmas daily reflections booklets. This booklet contains meditations for each day of Advent. I invite everyone to take a copy home and read as one way to come closer to Christ during this holy season. Have a blessed weekend.
