Message for the week of December 7:

A Minute with Jesus: Jesus came into the world so that we might know God's love. It is deeply moving to read these words from Scripture: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). During this holy season of Advent, we want to take time to ponder the meaning of Christmas, as proof of God's love for us. The Nativity of Our Lord celebrates the point in history when the Son of God took on human flesh for our Salvation – an act of loving obedience to the Father, and saving love for us, in order to offer Himself for us on the Cross, and now, give Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Heavenly Father, help me to realize how much You love me in that You sent Your Son on the first Christmas as my Savior. This week, read how the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that She would be the Mother of our Savior in Luke 1:26-38.

Advent - A Time of Preparation: The four weeks leading up to Christmas are to be different from our ordinary routine. Yet it is not meant to be a time of celebration, as that really begins on Christmas Eve. Advent is to be spent preparing our hearts for the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ, who came to save us from sin and eternal death. This focus of spiritual preparation and joyful anticipation can be difficult to maintain in the hectic hustle and bustle of the materialistic side of this sacred season. An important point for Advent is to keep everything simple by placing a limit on shopping and baking, while setting aside time for quiet prayer and for simply being with family members. Most of us don't need more gifts, but rather more time with each other. It is an opportunity to gather the family and prepare by remembering the darkness that pervaded the time of the people of God as they awaited the birth of the Savior.


The purple candles stand for repentance-being sorry and making up for

From the Pastor's Pen

Second Sunday of Advent

Quite likely you have a long checklist of things that you need to do before Christmas, which is now only three weeks away. But is "repentance for the forgiveness of sins" on that list? Advent is the time given to us to revive our hopes for the glorious coming of our Savior. St John teaches us to prepare the way for the Lord. But it is not about the path in a literal sense, but rather about our hearts, about our conversion, that is, cleansing ourselves from sins, about getting rid of pride and selfishness, about smoothing out roughness in dealing with our neighbors, about acting for what is good. And so, we have to make our own lives a straight path to God, a path without potholes we can fall into nor compromises that can send us on a detour. This is our task. Let us not waste the time that is given to us - let us convert ourselves and pray for the conversion of others.

Next Wednesday is advent confession at St Joseph. There will be one more priest assisting me from 6:15 pm. Please make yourself available to prepare for Christmas. On Wednesday December 18th confessions will be available at St Peter. How are valleys filled in, mountains made low, paths made straight, and rough ways smoothed? There is only one answer: Repentance!

Normally on December 9 we celebrate the feast of SAINT JUAN DIEGO but this year we celebrate the feast of the IMMACULATE CONCEPTION of the BLESSED VIRGIN MARY. Under the title of the Immaculate Conception, the Blessed Virgin is the patron of the United States. This is a major feast—in fact a Holy Day of Obligation—for the Church in the United States of America. This year is an exception with the feast not being a holy day of obligation. But we do have masses in both churches. Mary as the Immaculate Conception is the Patron Saint of the United States and Brazil.
