From the Pastor's Pen Second Sunday of Lent

On the second Sunday of Lent, we always hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples—Peter, James and John. While Jesus was praying "the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white." Moses and Elijah were also there talking with Jesus.

The three of the apostles saw a glimpse, a tiny glimpse, of who Jesus was. That would transform them and sustain them through some dark moments following Jesus' arrest and passion. The transfiguration experience of Jesus is about a message of hope and encouragement in moments of doubt and despair. This is an experience of reassurance. In those moments, what we hear is "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him." as we continue our Lenten journey and Jesus continues his own journey towards Jerusalem. Remember that on Wednesdays I encourage families to come to the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 at St. Joseph and 7:30 at St. Peter. Through it we relive the Via Dolorosa (Sorrowful Street) with Christ guided by passages from the scriptures and prayers from the liturgy. This is one of the ways by which we can participate in Lent, focused on Jesus and his passion which he endured for us. Have a blessed Lent.

Stations of the Cross: On Wednesdays during Lent we will recite the Stations of the Cross beginning at 7:30 pm with Adoration to follow. This is a prayerful biblical meditation of 14 incidents from the Gospel accounts and traditions of the journey of Jesus from Pilate's house to being placed in the tomb. If you would like to volunteer to be the reader, please contact the parish office. Children's Choir: You've been making good progress learning the parts to the new Mass of St. Brigid. Our next Saturday practice will be March 22nd at 3:00 pm. We will also practice after mass on Sunday March 30th. We will be singing this new mass on Easter Sunday. All school age children are welcome to join at any time. * The adult choir will sing the Mass of St. Brigid for the Easter Vigil mass. *

Penance Services Available: There will be confessions available at St. Peters on April 9th beginning at 6:30 pm until done. As previous years, there will be 2 priests available. This year the sacristy location will have a divider to be able to choose between a private or face-to-face confession. Two priests will be available at St. Josephs on Wednesday, April 2nd, beginning at 6:30 pm until done. There is also an opportunity at the Cathedral on April 14th from 9:00 AM-6:00 PM with several priests available.

Diocesan Annual Appeal: We have reached our goal of \$12,520. Don't stop now!! Any money collected over our goal comes back to St. Peter's for our own use towards projects and evangelization.

First Sunday Rosary: We pray the rosary on the first Sunday of each month in church at 7:30 PM. The next one will be April 6th. Please plan to attend to pray as our Holy Mother has called us to do.

Anointing of the Sick: Fr. Biju will be available to perform this Sacrament on the first Friday of the month after daily mass. Please contact him directly if you or a family member would like to receive. This is available next on April 4th.

An Opportunity for a Deeper Experience of God's Presence - Jubilee of Hope 2025: You are encouraged to participate in this Jubilee of Hope to receive God's gifts and experience His presence in a much deeper way. The gift of hope is especially important for us. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines hope as "the theological virtue by which we desire the Kingdom of Heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (CCC 1817).
