Message for the week of March 2:

A Minute with Jesus: As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. We humbly give our assent to what has been handed on to us for the last 2,000 years through the one Church that Jesus founded. This assent (giving our "yes—I choose to believe") involves our commitment to persistence in prayer and study of Scripture in asking Jesus for deeper understanding regarding His Real Presence in the Eucharist. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Lord Jesus, "I believe; please help my unbelief." (Mark 9:24) This week, read how a father gives his assent to believing that Jesus can heal his son in Mark 9:20-29.

Men of the Cross "Freedom in Forgiveness": Our relationship with Christ is many things. He is your refuge, someone to celebrate your joys, mourn with you in your sorrows and is the one to break the chains that bind you and set you free. What are the chains that bind you? The world tries to convince you that the baggage you carry is not too heavy and that you probably deserve to carry that burden. But that is a lie. Christ wants you to be set free. There is Freedom in Forgiveness! Maybe you have been carrying around the same burden for a long time. Maybe you really don't understand forgiveness, how to forgive others, or how to forgive yourself. You may have forgotten what it feels like to be free. 

Ash Wednesday

This Wednesday is the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday. Lent is a special time when we prepare ourselves for Good Friday and Easter Sunday.





Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher."

This weekend's we find Jesus sharing with his disciples, parables that highlight the importance of discernment and self-awareness in our spiritual journey. Lent is a good time to reflect about it as we begin our Lenten journey on Wednesday. It can be a great journey of self-awareness and surrender to the Lord. One can definitely make use of this season to evaluate our priorities and renew oneself. If we treat Lent no different than any normal day, Easter will just be just eggs and chocolate bunnies!

We can do the simple task of getting ashes on Ash Wednesday. Lent is more than that. We may give up many things, but it should also have some purpose with which I consciously consider change in life. The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Lenten regulations are as follows:

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u>: We will have mass here on Wednesday, March 5th at 8:00 PM. <u>ALL WEDNESDAY NIGHT STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND.</u> There are also masses available at St. Joseph's at 8:30 AM and 6:00 PM.

BIBLE Study: There will be a Bible study on Tuesday evenings at the St. Joseph school hall beginning March 11th and continuing March 18th, 25th, April 1st, 8th, and 15th called "Prayer: Finding Intimacy with God" with a clear teaching and artistry of the Augustine Institute's Lectio series, Dr. Tim Gray masterfully uses the discipline of Lectio Divina to show you how to make prayer an effective effort of love and intimacy. In six video sessions Lectio: "Prayer: Finding Intimacy with God" captures the secret to opening our hearts and minds to Scripture as the means to hear from God and then respond in conversation, basking in his presence and resolving to live in and through his love. <u>Stations of the Cross</u>: On Wednesdays during Lent we will recite the Stations of the Cross beginning at 7:30 pm with Adoration to follow. This is a prayerful biblical meditation of 14 incidents from the Gospel accounts and traditions of the journey of Jesus from Pilate's house to being placed in the tomb. Please plan to come and prepare for the Easter season.

<u>Penance Services Available</u>: There will be confessions available at St. Peters on April 9th beginning at 6:30 pm until done. As previous years, there will be 2 priests available. This year the sacristy location will have a divider to be able to choose between a private or face-to-face confession. Two priests will be available at St. Josephs on Wednesday, April 2nd, beginning at 6:30 pm until done. There is also an opportunity at the Cathedral on April 14th from 9:00 AM-6:00 PM with about 6 priests available.
