Message for the week of March 23:

A Minute with Jesus: Spend time in Jesus' Presence and you will Gradually Come to Know that Jesus *is* Indeed There. The desire to strengthen your faith requires some action on your part. It helps to go to the church and spend time with the mindset that Jesus is there. Take your problems and speak with Jesus. Even if you leave without anything seemingly having happened, you will gradually come to know Jesus *is* indeed there. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Lord, help me to spend a few minutes in church and speak with You. This week, read how Jesus appears to Thomas who was not present when He first appeared to the apostles after His Resurrection. Thomas, when He does see Jesus, falls before Him and says "My Lord and My God" (John 20:19-29).

The Important Season of Lent: During the season of Lent, the major focus is on three pillars: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Regarding prayer, a transformative way of praying is incorporating a daily examination of conscience. This simple process takes about five minutes. Before climbing into bed, think back over the day in a broad sweep and give thanks to God for two things. Also, think back on how personal selfishness was manifested in your dealings with others and ask the Lord to forgive you. Fast from one thing that you particularly like, such as some type of social media, a type of food or a tv program, etc. Offer up this sacrifice for a member of your family who is struggling. Almsgiving is about sharing what we have with the poor not only money but also ourselves - by serving someone in need.

From the Pastor's Pen **Third Sunday of Lent**

Today's Gospel passage reminds us that life is precious and the gift of time on this earth is just that — a gift. Let's take a moment to reflect on this profound truth. None of us knows how much time we have, so we must use this gift intentionally to glorify God and serve our neighbor.

Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to illustrate this truth further. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree, hoping it will bear fruit. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn't doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?

The season of Lent is a time to carefully reflect on how we spend our time. Do we make God our priority, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give the next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens, or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or misplaced priorities on our use of time. Remember, God is merciful but just. Let's turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time, knowing that our potential for spiritual growth is limitless with His grace.

St. Peter's Soup Supper: As another Lent progresses, we should gather with our parish family to enjoy fellowship. Join us on Wednesday, April 16th at 6:30 pm for soup and other delectables in the church basement. Following the meal there will be Stations of the Cross (7:30 pm) and Adoration/Prayer time to follow. EVERYONE IS WELCOME!! Stations of the Cross: On Wednesdays during Lent we will recite the Stations of the Cross beginning at 7:30 pm with Adoration to follow. This is a prayerful biblical meditation of 14 incidents from the Gospel accounts and traditions of the journey of Jesus from Pilate's house to being placed in the tomb. If you would like to volunteer to be the reader, please contact the parish office. Children's Choir: You've been making good progress learning the parts to the new Mass of St. Brigid. We will practice after mass on Sunday March 30th. We will be singing this new mass on Easter Sunday.
